- A Bachelor's Degree from a United States (US) regionally accredited four year institution or a non-U.S. equivalent institution
- Undergraduate coursework in English, Biology & laboratory, General Chemistry & laboratory, Organic Chemistry & laboratory, Physics & laboratory, and Mathematics.
- A minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0, and a minimum science GPA of 2.7 (in Biology, Chemistry, Physics, and Mathematics)
- Completed online application form (including the Statement of Purpose)
- Official transcripts of all college level coursework or the American Medical College Application Service (AMCAS) report
- Curriculum Vitae



We are pleased to announce that:

- 71% of PMPB students who completed the two-semester curriculum were accepted to California Northstate University (CNU) professional schools for class of 2020.
- ◆ Of these students, 80% were admitted to College of Medicine and 20% were accepted to College of Pharmacy.

To be considered competitive candidates for the College of Medicine at CNU, applicants should have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.2 and an MCAT score of 510 or higher.

Students are also exposed to real-world medical practice opportunities such as clinical case presentations and role-playing as standardized patients for College of Medicine (COM). In addition, professional advising for medical school application and COM interview are provided to assist PMPB students.

The College of Health Sciences of California Northstate University has received the prestigious CalPOST-BAC grant to support the Central Valley Initiative!

The Central Valley Initiative (CVI) is a funded project supported by the Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development.

The CVI's ultimate goal is to: assist pre-medicine post-baccalaureate (PMPB) students, who are from underserved backgrounds and enrolled at California Northstate University (CNU), to succeed in seeking admission to medical school.

CVI provides:

- Outreach to students in the underserved regions.
- Twelve (12) student stipends for eligible CNU PMPB students. Each recipient will receive \$3,500 to offset educational costs.
- Mentoring and tutoring for students in need.

Who is eligible to apply for the CVI student stipends?

- California residents who were previously denied admission to all medical schools applied verified by the American Medical College Application Service (AMCAS) report.
- Pre-med students seeking a Doctor of Medicine (MD) or Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine (DO) degree.
- College graduates with a Bachelor's Degree from a United States regionally accredited college or university
- Enrolled PMPB students at CNU
- Members of underserved populations and/or underrepresented professionals in medicine
- Preference will be given to residents of Sacramento, San Joaquin, Stanislaus, Merced, Madera, Kern, Kings, and Fresno counties.
